Work will be started at once on the erection of a residence for the new owner's occupancy. Dr. Samuel Schechter bought through Mr. Johnson a plot 65 by 125 feet on the west side of Netherland Avenue, in the Edgehill Terrace section of Spuyten Duyvil, from the Isaac. G. Johnson Estate. Mrs. Anne Flagg cooperated as broker in this deal.

Plans have been completed for the immediate erection of a house

on the west side of Netherland Avenue, 183 feet north of West 230th Street, where George Gottlieb has bought a plot from Ralph Brigham through the Johnson organization.

The Fifth Avenue Bank of New York leased the house at the north-
